A visit to the Club SLI site provides a showcase of Tom's projects. Members of Club SLI get special treatment at NVIDIA events and can get sneak when sourcing components for big projects. **How did you first get involved with Club SLI?**

After surfing the net, I saw all these customized and modified cases, so I built my first case mod in 2003. I'm a Club SLI member and can post pictures of these modified computers.

**How has Nvidia helped?**  
 NVIDIA provides modding with a 'Top Rig Of The Month' on its site and hosts mod contests at the GeForce LAN. It's the best place to see that really shows me to get when I need to maximize the performance of my case mod.

**Do you have customizing tips?**  
 Use quality hardware that is well built and has reputable partners. When remodeling, watch the temperature. NVIDIA-Monitors the temperature of your processor, video card, and system. **James Carey**

**Tribal Eclipse**  
 The basic concept was a tribal design to create the focal point of this case. It incorporates features that have not been done so we really own as a case mod. It has specially formulated heat sensitive paint that changes color based on temperature.



**Superheron**  
 Designed to be a high performance LAN PC. The SLI and water-cooling required extra space so a stomach frame the SLI chassis was used and combined into a single unit. The swing-out side panels allow full access to internal components.



**Dragster**  
 Based on an import tuner show car, it comes with a custom side panel, carbon fiber accents, stealth wheels, a PhatMouse and a digital photo printer. It has Intel Pentium 4 3.0GHz running at 4.5GHz, an SLI 6800 motherboard and Dungeon Diva water-cooling blocks.



**TRIBAL ECLIPSE:**  
 The case modder's choice for a case, the Tribal Eclipse is a dark, heavy-duty wood-grain case with a circular cutout on top.



**SUPERHERON:**  
 The case modder's choice for a case, the Superheron is a dark, heavy-duty wood-grain case with a circular cutout on top.



**DRAFTER:**  
 The case modder's choice for a case, the Dragster is a dark, heavy-duty wood-grain case with a circular cutout on top.
